



The Brazos Transit District is a rural and small urban Transit District Serving 19 counties in Central and East Texas.

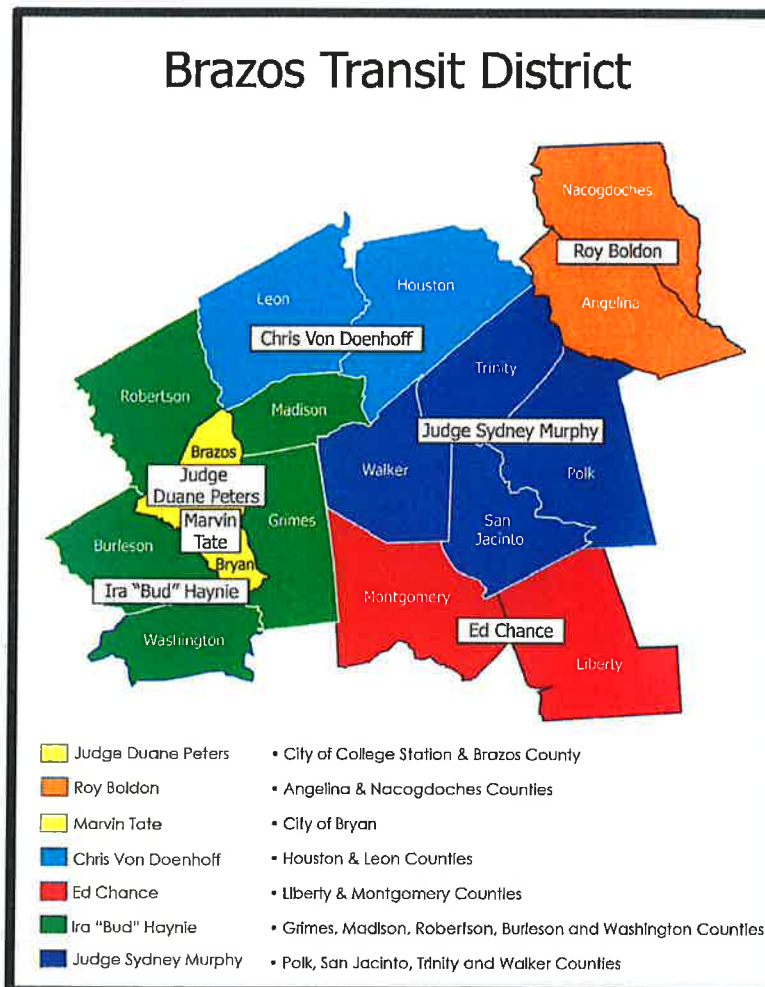

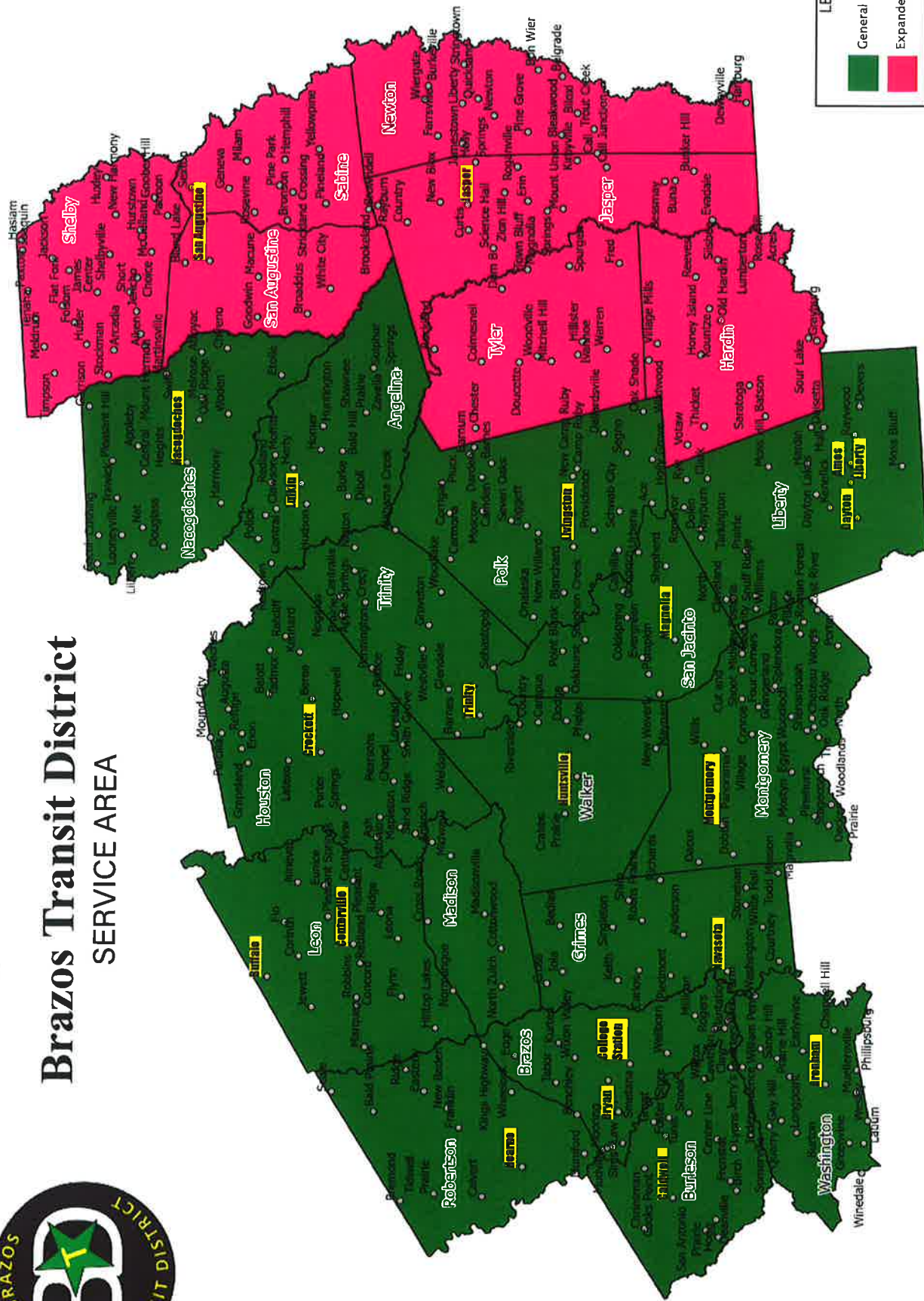
Brazos Transit District (BTD), a Political Subdivision of the State of Texas, is a Rural and Small Urban Transit District serving 16 counties in Central and East Texas. Our service area is comprised of over 13,300 square miles with a population of 1,235,930. BTD is now the third largest rural transit district in Texas by square miles and provides more trips than any other rural transit district statewide. Our current service area includes the following counties: Angelina (City of Lufkin), Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Houston, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Montgomery, Nacogdoches (City of Nacogdoches), Polk, Robertson, San Jacinto, Trinity, Walker, and Washington. BTD operates a fleet of 110 vehicles ranging in size from 10 ADA accessible passenger vans to 100 passenger buses. BTD provides an array of services to meet the local needs including fixed routes, demand response and veterans' shuttles. Services provided by BTD are essential to the everyday lives of the Texans we serve. Funding for BTD is a combination of federal and state funding, as well as annual funding from local governments, as a contractor for a Medicaid transportation broker, and collected fares. BTD operates on an annual budget of \$22 million.
