These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by San Jacinto County.

**REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS**

On or about October 23, 2024, San Jacinto County (County) will submit a request to the Texas General Land Office for the release of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds appropriated under the Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act, 2019 (Pub. L. 116-120), as amended, to undertake a project known as Flood and Drainage Improvements under GLO Contract #24-067-040-E228 to mitigate future flooding by improving the conveyance of storm water.

**Project Description:** Subrecipient shall improve drainage, rehabilitate street, and complete associated appurtenances.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION**

San Jacinto County certifies to the Texas General Land Office that Fritz Faulkner, in his capacity as County Judge, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The Texas General Land Office's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the County to use Program funds.

## **OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS**

The Texas General Land Office will accept objections to its release of funds and the County's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request, (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the County; (b) the County has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the Texas General Land Office; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to Heather Lagrone, Texas General Land Office, Community Development and Revitalization, PO Box 12873 Austin, Texas 78711-2873, or [env.reviews@recovery.texas.gov](mailto:env.reviews@recovery.texas.gov).
